Planning for 2019/20

We are deep in planning work at the moment, preparing for the new Patient Safety Collaborative (PSC) workstreams for 2019/20. These will be focusing on four themes: deterioration, maternal and neonatal health, medications safety, and adoption and spread. See below for more detail on what's included in each area.

In 2018/19 we carried out some great work with many of you in the region, focusing in particular on acute and ambulance care. Over the coming year we will continue to build upon this important work, but will be widening our scope to include community settings. This includes care homes, general practice

and community trusts. For the Deterioration workstream, we are looking for a GP practice, a care home and a community provider to work with on one or more of the following:

- Testing NEWS2
- Soft signs of deterioration
- SBAR
- Safety Huddles

We will be offering bespoke quality improvement coaching and support. Get in touch if you are interested in getting involved.

I'm looking forward to keeping you posted on all of our plans as this exciting work continues to develop and progress. Watch this space.

New PSC workstreams decided for 2019/20

The new Patient Safety Collaborative workstreams have now been set for 2019/20, giving structure to our work over the coming year.

The workstreams will be:

- Deterioration to reduce avoidable harm for patients who may be at risk of or experiencing physical deterioration in acute and community settings - recognition, response and escalation – underpinned by excellent communication
- Maternal and Neonatal Health Safety Collaborative continue to support maternal and neonatal care services to provide a safe, reliable and quality healthcare experience to all women, babies and families across maternity care setting
- Medications safety details to be confirmed by NHS Improvement
- Adoption and spread projects helping to spread tested interventions including:
 - COPD Discharge Care Bundle
 - Emergency Laparotomy Care Bundle
 - PReCePT
 - Emergency Department Checklist.
- Update on funding for Life QI tool

We contacted trusts last month to notify that LifeQI will no longer be funded by Eastern PSC beyond 31 March 2019. Organisations with under 50 users will be supported by See Data Ltd directly from 1 April 2019 and current organisations that exceed over 50 users will be contacted by LifeQI to discuss next steps and options. We will continue to have regional overview of all licences until 31 March 2019. Please contact improvement@eahsn.org if you have any questions.
