Whilst we talk about the NHS, in reality there are four versions of the NHS in the UK (although the health service is not called the NHS in Northern Ireland, rather the Health and Social Care Services). When power was devolved to the four nations in the UK, responsibility for the NHS also was passed over to the government of each nation. Consequently, Scotland, Wales, England and Northern Ireland all have a version of the NHS which works independently and differently to other nations. This accounts for differences between health care across the nations, the abolition of the prescription charge in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland being an example of this.
